

Psalm 126:1-6 Restore Our Blessings

While we look back to God's great redeeming work in Christ, and while we struggle today, we constantly hope for and long for our future restoration.

1. We joyfully look back to the first coming of Christ in order to redeem us, since that gives meaning to every past moment of rejoicing. (v. 1-3)
